- 3. Describe Napoleon's eating arrangements (there are 3 possible elements to include).
- 4. How do the other animals (not the pigs) now refer to Napoleon?
- 5. The pigs like to make up other titles for Napoleon, which are ironic epithets. Give one example of such a title.
- 6. The pigs become involved in a trade battle between Pilkington and Frederick. What are the pigs selling?
- 7. How does Frederick trick the animals in this chapter?
- 8. The humans attack the next day. The destroy the Windmill. Which historical event could the Battle of the Windmill be linked?
- 9. After the attack, the animals are 'weary and bleeding' and they 'limp back towards the farm', walking past dead comrades. How does Squealer then approach them?
- 10. After the battle and the procession, the pigs celebrate. What do they drink?
